Instructions for Oral Presentations

All rooms will be equipped with a laptop and a projector/smart board. The operating system will be Windows 11 Professional and available software will be Microsoft Office 365(including MS Word, MS PowerPoint, MS Excel), Adobe Acrobat, Windows Media Player, and VLC media player).

Oral Paper Sessions

Oral presentations will be 10 minutes in duration, with an additional 5 minutes allocated for questions and answers. Presenters are requested to submit the Microsoft PowerPoint slides of their presentations prior to the given deadline.

Presentation Guidelines (available on IPRC 2024 website)

1. The accepted abstract must be presented as an oral presentation at the conference by the authors.
2. Presentations will be presented onsite and online.
3. Only the presented abstracts will be included in the final version of the abstract book.
4. All the authors of an accepted abstract who will be presenting at the conference must complete the registration. If you fail to register, the abstract will be removed from the conference program and proceedings.
5. Each presenter will be given 10 minutes to present their presentation and an additional 5 minutes will be allocated for a question-and-answer session.
6. Please ensure that you stick to the time allocated. You will be requested to stop the presentation if you exceed 10 minutes.
7. All the presentations should be prepared in PowerPoint, and it is advised to use the IPRC PowerPoint Template given at the IPRC 2024 website <https://shorturl.at/Cysv8>
8. The first slide of the presentation should include the presentation title, abstract ID, name(s) of the author(s), and the affiliation/s of the author/s and underline the names of presenter(s).
9. Include your abstract ID in the first slide of your presentation as shown here: IPRC_24_Abtract ID (Ex: IPRC_24_123)
10. An author mentioned in the abstract should make the presentation.
11. Any photographs/images used in PowerPoint should be of adequate resolution. Videos must not be used in the presentation. If playing a video is essential for your presentation, please contact FGS at least four days prior to the date of the conference.
12. The presenter is recommended to use graphs and figures instead of tables where necessary in the oral presentation.
13. Readable font colors should be used in the slides, and it is advisable not to use light colors. i.e. light blue/light yellow.
14. Save the presentation file in the format <IPRC_2024_Abtract ID>, for example: IPRC_24_156
15. All submissions should be made directly via Google Form, <https://shorturl.at/KNz1o> on or before 13th November 2024.

The University of Kelaniya (UoK)

The University of Kelaniya is situated in the ancient and historic city of Kelaniya, a city reported to be visited by Buddha in the 5th century BC. The University is conveniently located just outside the municipal limits of the capital city, Colombo, near the Colombo-Kandy Road. The University of Kelaniya has its origin in the historic Vidyalankara Pirivena, founded in 1875 as a centre of learning for Buddhist monks. It was one of the two great national centres of traditional higher learning, heralding the first phase of the national movement and national resurgence. With the establishment of modern Universities in Sri Lanka in the 1940s and 1950s, the Vidyalankara Pirivena became the Vidyalankara University in 1959, later the Vidyalankara Campus of the University of Ceylon in 1972 and, ultimately, the University of Kelaniya in 1978.

The Faculty of Graduate Studies (FGS)

The FGS coordinates with all the Boards of Study in the university, offering research degrees, degrees with only coursework or coursework and research. All the postgraduate degree programs offered by the FGS conform to the relevant Sri Lanka Qualification Framework (SLQF) guidelines. The FGS specifies requirements for postgraduate admission and establishes and regulates standards with respect to the quality of postgraduate teaching and research. The FGS also promotes intra-faculty, inter-faculty, inter-university and international collaborations in postgraduate teaching and research. The quality of postgraduate research projects of the students is strictly monitored by a proposal presentation, biannual progress reports and progress presentations. The FGS consists of Boards of Study established based on the subject areas.

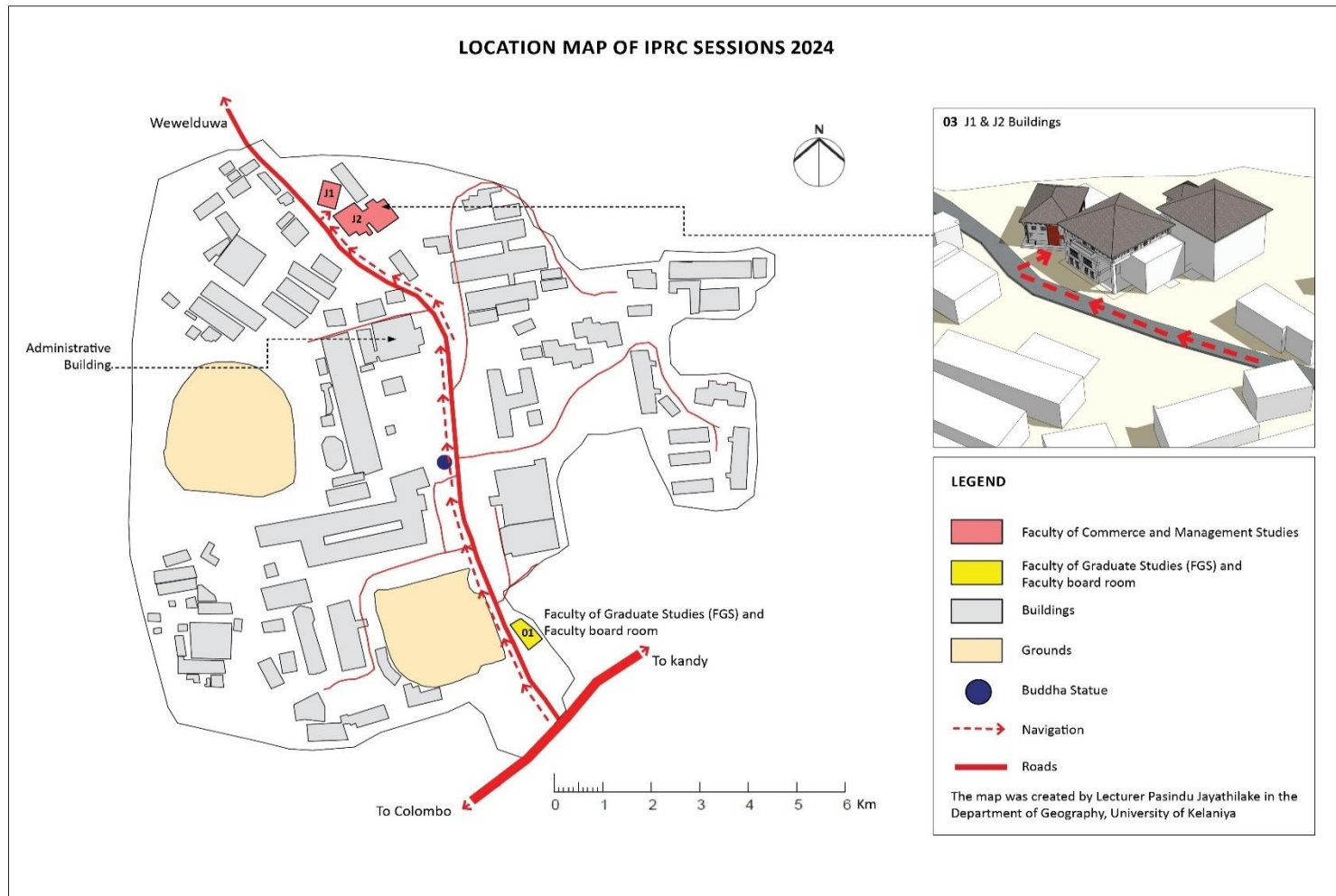

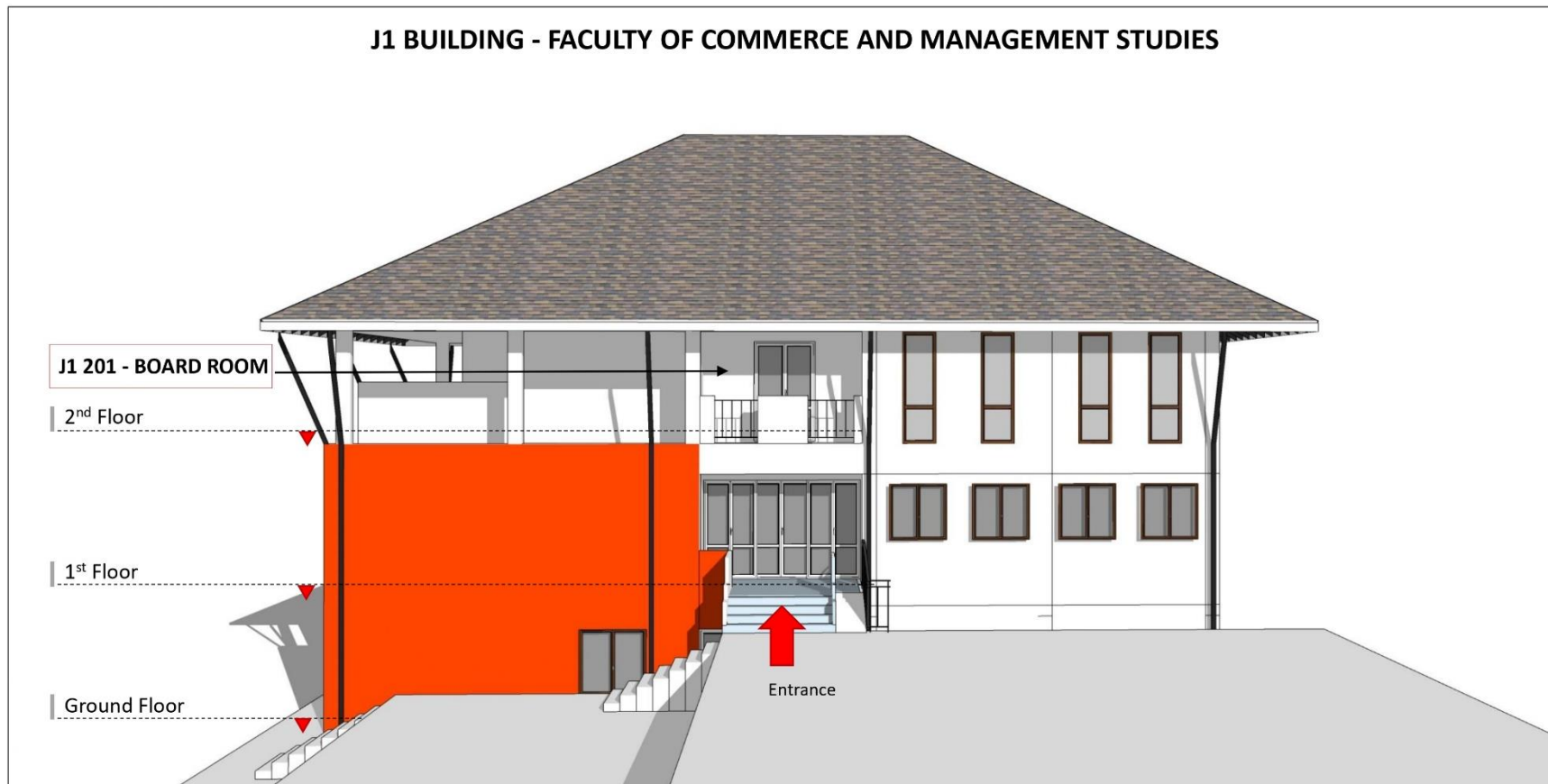
